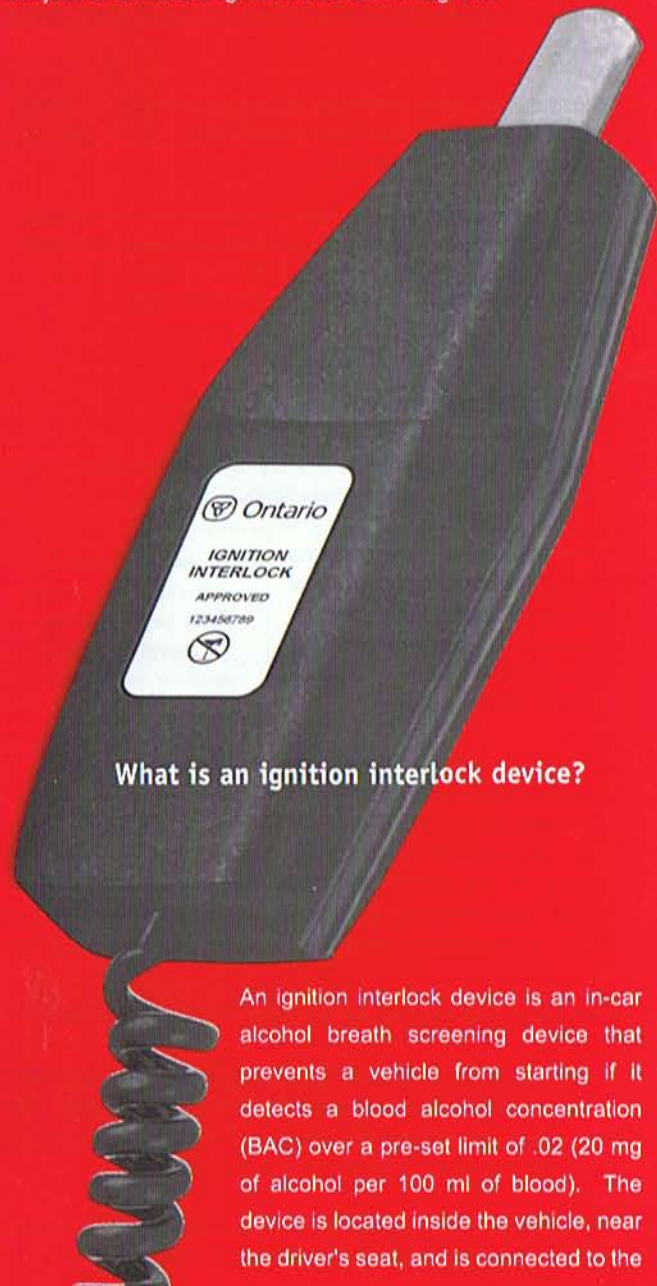


Ontario has a new tool to help prevent drinking and driving. As of December 23, 2001, individuals who commit an impaired driving offence under the Criminal Code of Canada and are convicted, are subject to Ontario's Ignition Interlock Program.



What is an ignition interlock device?

An ignition interlock device is an in-car alcohol breath screening device that prevents a vehicle from starting if it detects a blood alcohol concentration (BAC) over a pre-set limit of .02 (20 mg of alcohol per 100 ml of blood). The device is located inside the vehicle, near the driver's seat, and is connected to the

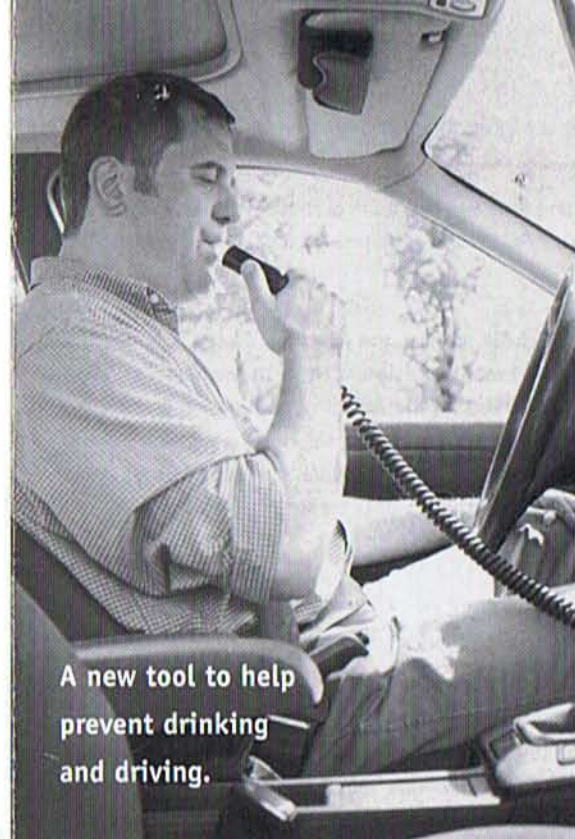

# IGNITION

The Ontario government has introduced tough measures against drinking and driving, including the Administrative Driver's Licence Suspension program, increased suspension periods for repeat offenders, a mandatory assessment and education or treatment program, as well as increased fines and vehicle impoundment for those who continue to drive while suspended.

Yet drinking and driving continues to cause death and injury on Ontario's roads. Every year there are about 16,000 drinking and driving convictions in Ontario. An estimated 80 per cent of convicted drinking drivers are first-time offenders.
